FAMILY HISTORY RESOURCES

- <u>Family files:</u> Contain various resources including newspaper clippings, correspondence, previous genealogy research and more! These files are often a good starting point when conducting research on individuals and families within Cortland County. Check the index on our website to see if we have a file on your family!
- Genealogy & local history books
- <u>City directories</u> for Cortland, Homer, McGraw: Find out where your ancestors lived and worked.
- <u>Maps & atlases:</u> See exactly where your ancestors lived in Cortland County in 1855, 1863, and 1876.
- <u>Archives and manuscripts:</u> Early original town records can provide unique and useful information. Some of these records have indexes and transcriptions that make searching for particular people easy!
- <u>Photographs:</u> You might find some images of your ancestors or the places they lived and worked!
- <u>Cemetery binders</u>: Includes gravestone readings from the 1930s-40s. Does not include official burial records.

BUILDINGS, BUSINESSES, AND MORE

- <u>General files:</u> Newspaper clippings and other materials gathered by topic provide information on businesses, organizations, events, and more.
- <u>Programs & advertisements</u>

- <u>Sanborn maps</u> show the evolution of buildings in Cortland from 1884-1960s.
